2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF JOB DUTIES

Since July 2003, I have held a 1.0 FTE appointment in the Department of Clinical and Health Psychology in the College of Public Health and Health Professions.

- a. Research
My independent program of research integrates three areas of research: psycho-oncology, psychoneuroimmunology (PNI), and women's health. Job duties include preparing grant applications in order to seek/receive external funding and preparing manuscripts for publication in peer reviewed journals in behavioral/psychosomatic medicine, psycho-oncology, and PNI.
- b. Teaching
 - i. Research Mentorship
Since arriving at UF in 2003, I have served as an active research mentor for predoctoral and postdoctoral students in clinical health psychology. Current primary mentees in the Department of Clinical and Health Psychology include: Sally Jensen (5th year student, PhD candidate, 2007 Recipient of the College of Public Health and Health Professions Outstanding Research Award, 2007 Recipient of the Department of Clinical and Health Psychology's Medical Psychology Area Research Award, 2006 Recipient of American Psychosomatic Society Travel Award and Citation Poster), Stacy Dodd (3rd year student, PhD candidate, 2006 Recipient of Psychoneuroimmunology Research Society Travel Award), Lindsey Boegehold (2nd year student, PhD candidate), and Tim Sannes (1st year student, 2008 Recipient of a College of Public Health and Health Professions Grant Award). In Fall 2008, I will also be supervising Seema Patidar (incoming 1st year student), Stephanie Garey (incoming 1st year student), and Megan Lipe (rising 2nd year student, PhD candidate). I also routinely serve as a doctoral committee member for students in the College of Nursing and in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences'

Department of Psychology. In addition, I provide research mentorship to predoctoral students completing their internship year in the Department of Clinical and Health Psychology. Current interns that I am providing research mentorship to include Lisa Christian (Ohio State University) and Stacy Parenteau (University of Kansas). In addition, I provide research mentorship to approximately one to three undergraduate honors students in any given year, as well as to undergraduates who are engaging in independent research for credit (CLP 3911). Currently, I am also serving as the research mentor to a University of Florida Undergraduate Scholar Award recipient (Zarabeth Golden). I am also co-mentoring a postdoctoral student in research design/methodology, data analysis, and manuscript preparation (Evangelia Banou).

ii. *Clinical Teaching*

I serve as the Attending Psychologist for the Psycho-Oncology Service in the UF/Shands Psychology Clinic. My primary role is to train and supervise predoctoral and postdoctoral students in the psychological evaluation and treatment of oncology patients. I currently supervise core practicum students who are assigned to their first medical psychology practicum, as well as advanced practicum students who are seeking more intensive training in psycho-oncology. I also supervise the short- and long-term psychological treatment of individuals with chronic and life-limiting illnesses, carrying a supervision load of approximately 15 – 25 outpatients/inpatients at any given time.

iii. *Classroom-Based Teaching*

My area of graduate teaching expertise is the biopsychosocial aspects of women's health. I have developed a new course, which fulfills the Medical Psychology area's Advanced Behavioral Medicine and Health Psychology (CLP 7317) course requirement. This course is taught once every two years. My area of undergraduate teaching expertise is clinical health psychology. Along with Dr. Samuel F. Sears, I took over the responsibility of teaching this course from the Department of Psychology in 2004. Dr. Sears and I developed a new curriculum for this course, and we functioned as the primary instructors of this course in Spring 2004. Currently, I function as the supervisor of this course, which is now taught by predoctoral students in the Department of Clinical and Health Psychology. This course is taught once per year.

Advanced Health Psychology and Behavioral Medicine: Biopsychosocial Processes in Women's Health (3 credits)

Course Description:

This course, which I developed in 2005, examines the (a) pathophysiology of health processes and conditions unique to and primarily affecting women, (b) biopsychosocial predictors of health and well-being of women, and (c) biopsychosocial interventions to improve the health and well-being of women. Primary teaching methods include classroom based instruction and process-oriented discussion and dialogue.

Learning Objectives:

- (a) Discuss the pathophysiology of mental and physical health conditions with high prevalence and incidence among women.
- (b) Identify the biopsychosocial factors involved in the initiation, maintenance, and exacerbation of mental and physical illness among women.
- (c) Discuss the role of clinical health psychology interventions in the promotion of wellness and in the assessment and treatment of illness among women.

Course Description:

This course examines the theoretical and research foundations of behavioral health and illness from a biopsychosocial perspective. Health Psychology is a specialty within psychology that addresses the role of behavioral factors in health and illness. The field of Health Psychology is founded on the biopsychosocial model and includes "any scientific or professional application of psychological concepts or methods to any problem arising in the health system, not only the care giving system, but the public health, health education, health planning, health financing, health legislations and other such components of the total system" (Stone, 1979). The emergence of this field marks the expansion of psychology beyond the traditional concerns of mental health to the broader health care arena.

Learning Objectives:

- a) Identify the possible roles and contributions of clinical health psychology in addressing biopsychosocial model of health and illness.
- b) Discuss the behavioral factors that influence wellness and that play a role in the prevention, development, course, and outcome of many human diseases and health problems.
- c) Identify the roles that health psychologists play in promoting wellness and in assessing and treating psychological factors related to health and illness.

12. RESEARCH NARRATIVE

The long range goal of my research program is to improve health outcomes and promote the well-being of individuals with chronic and/or life-limiting illnesses, with an emphasis on malignancies that occur commonly or exclusively among women. Grounded in the biobehavioral model of tumor growth and development outlined by Antoni et al. (2006), my research seeks to understand the psychoneuroimmunologic (PNI) influences on cancer initiation, recurrence, progression, and mortality, as well as on cancer-related quality of life. To this end, my current research examines the relationships between psychosocial factors and intermediate endpoint cancer biomarkers, including glucocorticoid diurnal rhythm, proangiogenic and proinflammatory cytokine production, and heat shock protein expression among women undergoing cancer surgery. The results of these studies will inform the development of my future research, which will examine neuroendocrine and immune markers as mediators of a possible relationship between psychosocial factors and recovery from cancer resection, length of disease free interval, and length of disease free survival among individuals with cancer. Furthermore, these mechanistic studies will provide a strong foundation in which to examine the effects of cognitive behavioral interventions on the health and well-being of individuals with cancer. Specifically, this intervention research will examine the effects of a cognitive behavioral intervention for sickness behaviors (i.e., pain and sleep impairments) on inflammatory biomarkers and quality of life among individuals with cancer.

The primary missions of the Psycho-Oncology Clinical Division are (a) to provide comprehensive psychosocial

services informed by state-of-the-science research to individuals affected by cancer, and (b) to provide training in the evaluation and treatment of oncology patients to predoctoral graduate students and interns in clinical psychology at UF. The Clinical Division, which operates under the supervision of Dr. Pereira, a licensed clinical psychologist (PY 6849), is the only clinical service at the University of Florida that provides *psychological* evaluation and treatment services to oncology patients. Since July 1, 2006, the Psycho-Oncology service has performed nearly 200 hours of assessment services and delivered approximately 550 hours of treatment services to oncology patients at the University of Florida. The Table below outlines the service offered through the Psycho-Oncology Service in the Psychology Clinic at the University of Florida, as well as the providers who routinely refer to the service.
